City Ordinance Reminders:

Use the provided containers. Between days of regular collection, containers are to be stored on the side of the residence (rear or inside the garage are preferred locations if your property is a corner lot); Containers may be taken to the curb for collection no sooner than **Tuesday** noon and all items removed from the curb by noon Thursday. We are on the "B" week recycling.



All dogs and cats must be under the physical control of the owner or attendant by leash when off the owner's property. Their excrement must be removed immediately.

No person shall allow an animal to bark, yelp, whine, howl continuously for 15 minutes or for a total of 20 minutes in a one hour period.
