In accordance to Indiana IC 32.25.5, this communication to Members establishes the budget for October 2015 – September 2016 and was used to calculate the annual dues assessment. Your annual dues assessment dated October 1, 2015 is enclosed with this newsletter and is payable by October 30, 2015. Maplewood Community Association is a 501c7 corporation.

Legal News / Stats

Unfortunately, the association had to begin filing liens against properties for unpaid dues assessments. This caused significant upfront legal expenses which for the most part are recouped as the liens are paid.

This summary is current through August 11th.

Next year, we begin discussions on foreclosing on unpaid liens that will be 3 years old. Per Indiana Code \S 32-28-14-8, the statute allows for HOAs to foreclose on its liens in years 1-5. There will undoubtedly be an additional monetary investment needed for the foreclosures and the Board can only encourage members to fulfill their obligations to avoid such action.
