The most important of the "Three Rs" is **reduce**. Residents are encouraged to reduce waste by following these guidelines:

- · Buy only what you need
- Buy used products or those with recycled content
- · Use and reuse what you have
- · Donate, giveaway, or sell excess
- · Recycle or trash as a last resort





Repair

Reduce waste by repairing products and giving them a new life.

Shoes: cobblers can extend the life of your soles.

Clothing: tailors will fix your favorites like new.

Electronics: many phones, computers, and gadgets can be refurbished.

Furniture: recovery shops can change the look of furniture and undo damage.

Practice Zero Waste

The concept of decreasing the amount of trash and recycling produced by a person, business, or organization is termed "zero waste" because that is the ultimate goal. Taking steps to get there could include:

- Eliminating single-use plastic items like straws, utensils, cups, bottled water, grocery, or produce bags. Carry your own reusable alternatives.
- Finding permanent replacements for disposable items like razors, food storage bags, plastic wrap, and paper towels.
- Taking your own containers to the store for produce, bulk items, and deli foods.
- Bringing a washable take-out container with you when you go out to eat.
- Don't feel like you have to be perfect; just start somewhere!

Plastics numbered 1-7

- Flatten cardboard & bulky items

- Residential & nonprofit material only (call ACDEM for assistance with business recycling)







Curbside Recycling



For Fort Wayne households paying for garbage/ recycling through the city. For more information, call 311 or visit recyclefortwayne.org. Not everything that is recyclable can go in your cart; please place ONLY the following items at the curb:

PLASTICS #1-7

Recycle plastics labeled #1-7 (tubs, jugs, bottles). Rinse and let dry. Labels do not need removed.



CARDBOARD, NEWSPAPER, MAGAZINES

Recycle clean & dry paper only. This includes: cardboard, newspaper with inserts, magazines, catalogs, paperback books, phone books & brochures. Cut cardboard into 3 ft. pieces and flatten.

GLASS

Recycle clear, brown, green, & blue glass. Rinse; no need to remove labels. Remove lids & bottle caps from containers and recycle them in your cart.



Milk

PAPER FOOD BOXES

Recycle clean & dry paper food boxes, containers including egg, cereal & pasta boxes. It is not necessary to remove plastic windows.

METAL CANS, ALUMINUM FOIL, ALUMINUM PANS

Recycle all food & beverage metal cans. Rinse cans and recycle lids. Recycle clean aluminum foil & aluminum food pans.





PAPER

Recycle envelopes, computer paper, junk mail, greeting cards, & file folders. Remove rubber bands, metal fasteners & spiral wires. Do not need to remove windows, labels, or staples.

RECYCLE

Do Not Recycle These Items in Bin

The following items are generally not accepted in the recycling stream because they contaminate valuable recyclable items. Contaminants include:

Plastic bags

Put loose recyclables in bin and leave the plastic bags out. Many grocery stores offer plastic bag/film collection containers in front of their store for recycling drop-off.



Food or liquids

Items should be empty, clean, and dry. Food remains should go into compost, garbage disposal, or trash.



Donate these items if they are in good condition. Recycle metal hangers, holiday lights, and extension cords at a scrap metal dealer.



Mirrors, drinking glass, ceramics

Donate these items if in good condition or place them in the trash.



Donate these items if they are in good condition. Clean, dry textiles (including unwearable clothing and shoes) can be donated to Goodwill or Salvation Army for recycling. Label them "salvage."



Paper towels, napkins, plates, cups, tissues

Place these items in the trash or compost. Reduce your use of disposable products when possible.



Polystyrene foam (Styrofoam)

Polystyrene packaging like peanuts, foam, and bubble wrap that is clean and not damaged can be dropped off at a shipping/packing store for reuse. See pages 6-9.



Yard waste, wood

Compost your yard waste or drop it off at the location listed on page 41.



If you can't find a location that accepts your products for recycling, contact the product manufacturer to ask if they offer a takeback program for recycling their products responsibly.





Recycling & Composting in Apartments

You can reduce waste even if you live in an apartment or a multifamily community. Here's how:

1. Ask your landlord or building manager to offer recycling services.

ACDEM can advise them on the options available and provide educational presentations and signage to residents free of charge.

2. Use small, stackable bins for recycling.

Store bins in a closet, utility room, or corner. They should be clean and dry so they do not release odors. Bins can be taken to the recycling drop-off sites (see pages 10-11) for disposal.

3. Consider composting.

Many online resources offer instructions on food scrap recycling for apartments. Vermicomposting with worms is recommended for small spaces. It's easier than you think! See page 38-39 for more information.

4. Practice reducing waste.

It's the easiest way to produce less trash!

Frustrated by recycling?

You can influence companies to practice **Extended Producer Responsibility** by contacting the manufacturer and making your wishes known. Support good practices with purchasing power!

Extended Producer Responsibility: manufacturers take responsibility for the environmental effects of their product's life cycle, including materials used, production processes, and the use and disposal of their products.



Electronics Recycling

Electronics are banned from Indiana landfills because they contain toxic materials. They will not be picked up at the curb and must be taken to an appropriate recycling facility.



Allen County businesses and nonprofit agencies must register with ACDEM to participate in this program.

Residents will be assessed a fee to recycle up to FIVE items per trip. Fees subject to change.

TVs/CRTs/Monitors are priced separately:

Up to 46" = \$10

Larger than 46" = \$20



Plastic Bag & Plastic Film Recycling

Plastic bags and film packaging should **NOT** be recycled through curbside recycling programs or ACDEM's community recycling drop-off sites. Look for recycling bins near grocery store entrances to recycle properly.

Plastic bags and film packaging includes:

- Cereal box liners
- Dry cleaning bags
- Newspaper bags
- · Over wrap on cases of soda or canned vegetables
- Paper towel and toilet paper wrap
- Plastic retail bags
- Produce bags
- Sealed air pouches in mailed packages
- Ziploc and other zipper-styled bags (remove zippers prior to recycling)



Plastic bags and film packaging MUST be clean!



Residents may recycle plastic bags and plastic film in bins near grocery store entrances.





Recycle: Other Items

Carpet

Contact manufacturer or dealer to see if a recycling program exists; otherwise must be cut into 3 foot rolled sections for trash or taken to landfill.

Car Seats

If not expired or in an accident, car seats can be donated to reuse. Older or damaged seats can be recycled through a mail-in program: <u>babyearth.com/pages/renew</u>. Target has car seat collection days in September. Call 800-440-0680.

Clothing & Shoes

Textiles in unwearable condition can be donated to Goodwill or Salvation Army to be recycled properly.

Compostable Plastic

Allen County does not have an industrial compost facility to properly dispose of these items. They contaminate the recycling and should be avoided or put into the trash.

Cooking oil

Never put down the drain. Ask a local restaurant if they will combine your oil from home with theirs for proper disposal or pour into a container with kitty litter and throw in trash.

Diapers

Never put diapers in the recycling or toilet. Consider reusable diapers.

Eye Glasses

The local Lions Clubs sponsor an eyeglass reuse collection program. Many optometry stores offer collection boxes for eyeglasses. Visit *lionsclubs.org*.

Feminine Products

Flush only toilet paper. All other products should go in the trash, including wipes. Reduce waste by using a menstrual cup or applicator-free organic tampons.

Glass from Windows or Tabletops

These cannot go in regular recycling and will not be picked up by trash services. Drop off at Strategic Materials at 407 E. Garfield St., Ashley, IN (260-587-3000) to be recycled. May also be taken to the landfill.

Holiday Lights

Take broken strings of lights to a scrap metal recycler. Never put into a recycling bin as they will tangle in machinery.



Junk Mail

Though it can be recycled, reducing junk mail in the first place is preferred. Stop catalogs at <u>dmachoice.org</u>, opt out of credit card solicitations at optoutprescreen.com, and quit phone books at dexpages.com

Mattresses

There are no local facilities for recycling mattresses. Contact the manufacturer, dealer, or take to landfill. Consider purchasing natural material mattresses without springs or boxsprings.

Plant Pots

Lowes and some other nursery stores will take plastic pots, trays, and tags for reuse

Shredded Paper

Compostable. To recycle, put into a paper bag because it is too small for processing at the recycling facility. Never put recycling in plastic bags. Free shred days happen a few days per year. See for more information.

Smoke Detectors

They should not be put in the trash because some contain radioactive material. Contact manufacturer or visit <u>curieservices.com</u> for a take back service.

Stvrofoam

Our area does not have the specialized equipment needed to recycle polystyrene foam. Packing peanuts can be taken to mailing stores for reuse. Large pieces can be taken to animal relief agencies to build cat shelters (see Reuse section).

Syringes/Sharps

Mail-in containers are available at pharmacies. A sturdy plastic container like a laundry detergent bottle can be used, taped closed, labeled "sharps," and thrown in the trash.

Wipes

Never flush any type of wipe--even if the word "flushable" is printed on the package. Place wipes in the trash. Consider purchasing reusable wipes instead.

Online Resources for Reuse and Recycling

Consider selling or giving away items you no longer want. Several online marketplaces are available like *Craigslist, Freecycle, Facebook Marketplace, LetGo,* and *Nextdoor*.







Compost

Composting is the controlled decay of organic material (plant or animal-based) such as kitchen scraps, grass clippings, leaves, wood shavings, cardboard, and paper. Compostable material is also referred to as "biodegradable" material.

Composting recycles nutrients into new soil and keeps materials out of the landfill. By composting, we can save valuable space and prevent the generation of powerful greenhouse gases like methane that contribute to climate change.





Businesses may

compost on-site as long as a sturdy, washable container is used to prevent pests. Companies can save money and reduce their trash bill by composting! Contact ACDEM to learn how to get started.

How to Start a Compost Pile

The Lazy Way:


· Put anything that is biodegradable into a pile and wait.

The Quick Way:

- Buy or build a container with air holes.
- Layer "brown" material that contains carbon in a 2:1 ratio with "green" material that is nitrogen rich (see next page).
- Avoid adding meat, bones, dairy, or fish to keep away pests.
- Turn your pile frequently to accelerate the decomposition process.

Either way, you will eventually have a rich, natural fertilizer to place on your plants or garden. You may compost any way you like as long as you are respectful to your neighbors!
